

## ADVANCED NP-PRACTICE CREDENTIALING DOCUMENTS CHECKLIST

This checklist applies to applicants who plan to graduate from an FNP or AGNP program between Feb. 1 and June 15, 2022.

It is highly recommended that you plan well in advance to meet these deadlines. If you are accepted into the program and any of the following deadlines are not met, your offer may be rescinded.

<sup>i</sup> The California Board of Registered Nursing requires N.P.s who graduate from programs outside of California to first obtain their national board certification in order to apply for a California N.P. certificate and furnishing number. Given the board's lengthy processing time, out-of-state applicants completing an FNP or AGNP program on or after Feb. 1 must apply to AANP or ANCC by June 1, pass the nationally board exam by June 15 and submit a complete application for California licensure by July 1. There may be insufficient time for applicants completing programs outside of California in late May or early June to complete these steps by the due dates listed. Please consider your specific situation carefully before applying.
